Who can apply?

Educators at accredited post-secondary schools in Nebraska are invited to develop and teach a curriculum that incorporates the use of EHRs into new or existing coursework (ex. workshop, training module, unit) targeted to health professionals and/or support staff. When developing a curriculum, we encourage applicants to use the curriculum blueprints recently developed by the Office of the National Coordinator for Health Information Technology (ONC) Curriculum Development Centers. Purpose

The purpose of these federally funded awards is to better prepare Nebraska's healthcare workers to become meaningful users of EHRs across a variety of settings (hospitals, doctor's offices, nursing homes, pharmacies).

Wide River TEC will offer 12 awards of up to \$3000 in Round 2.
